

# Project Overview

The work consists of, but is not limited to, storm drain, open channel, roadway and utility improvements associated with the installation of a new storm drain system.

These improvements aim to upgrade infrastructure and provide flood reduction benefits within the project area.

## **Features:**

- 3600 linear feet of reinforced concrete pipe storm drains
- 1200 linear feet of reinforced concrete box storm drains
- 3100 linear feet of water main
- 2200 linear feet of wastewater main
- 9 water quality units

# What to Expect During Construction

**Construction Overview:** The contractor will use heavy equipment to dig trenches for new storm drain improvements, water and wastewater lines. Pavement will be restored as appropriate for the work being done.

**Construction Phases:** Crews will work in front of your property a number of times to complete each phase of the project, including excavation, storm drain and pipe installation, temporary paving, testing, repairs, if necessary, and final paving.

**Right of Way:** Most work will be limited to the right of way. The right of way spans from the street to a minimum of 10 feet behind the curb, in an area that you may consider to be part of your lawn.

# What to Expect During Construction

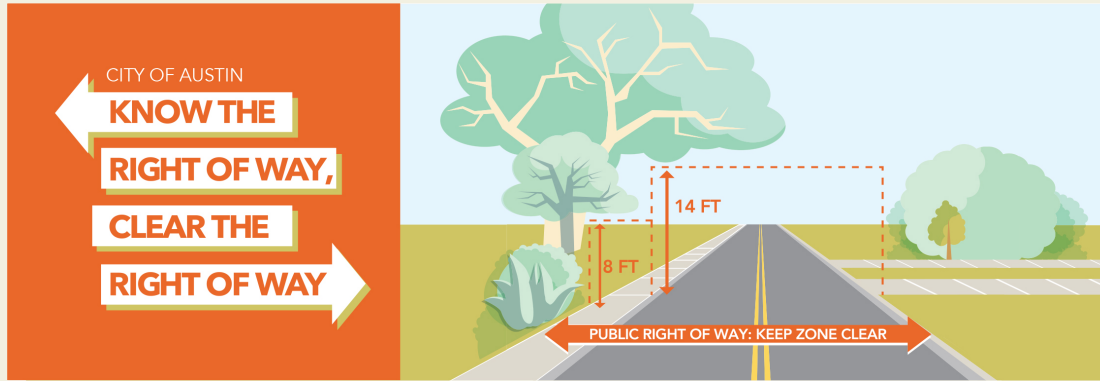
**Traffic:** During construction, travel on project streets will be impacted and may be reduced to one way traffic. You will always have access to your property - for brief periods, driveway access may be limited.

**Water Service:** At some point your water will be turned off to connect to the new line, but most likely just for a few hours on a single day. We will notify you via flyers posted on the door, prior to turning off the water. Emergency outages are possible should a water line break during construction.

**Project timeframe:** This project is anticipated to take 19 months to complete.



# What to Expect During Construction



**Tree Trimming:** The contractor may need to do some tree trimming over the Right of Way where trees are hanging lower than 14 feet.

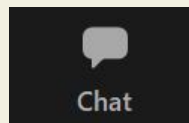
