

ORDINANCE NO. 59 1015A

AN ORDINANCE CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS, PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE URBAN RENEWAL LAW OF THE STATE OF TEXAS (ARTICLE 1269 1-3, VERNON'S ANNOTATED CIVIL STATUTES OF TEXAS), INCLUDING, PARTICULARLY, SECTION 5 AND 16(a) THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR THE FORM OF NOTICE THEREOF AND OF BALLOT FOR USE IN SAID ELECTION; PRESCRIBING THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to a resolution duly adopted on the 23rd day of July, 1959, and a notice duly published in the July 26, 1959, and October 4, 1959, issues of The American-Statesman, in the City of Austin, Travis County, Texas, in accordance with said Resolution, the City Council of the City of Austin, Texas, on the 8th day of October, 1959, at 10:00 o'clock A. M. met at City Hall in Austin, Texas, and held a public hearing on the question of whether or not said City Council will order an election, as required by the Urban Renewal Law of the State of Texas, to determine if the City Council should adopt a certain Resolution under said Urban Renewal Law, substantially in the form set forth in the form of Notice contained in Section 4 hereof; and,

WHEREAS, after due consideration of said questions and of the matters presented at said public hearing, the City Council has determined to call said election; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

SECTION 1. That in accordance with the provisions of the Urban Renewal Law of the State of Texas (Article 1269 1-3, Vernon's Annotated Civil Statutes of Texas), including, particularly, Section 3 and 16(a) thereof, a special election within the corporate limits of the City of Austin, Texas, is hereby ordered to be held on the 5th day of December, 1959, to determine whether the City Council of Austin, Texas, should adopt a resolution substantially in the form set forth in the form of Notice contained in Section 4 hereof.

SECTION 2. Only legally qualified voters residing within the corporate limits of the City of Austin, Texas, owning taxable property within said corporate limits who have duly rendered such property for taxation, shall be entitled to vote at said election.

SECTION 3. Except as otherwise provided herein, said election shall be held and conducted during the hours and in the manner, and the ballots cast shall be canvassed and the returns made and the results declared, all substantially as required by the applicable provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the State of Texas and the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Austin, Texas, with respect generally to special elections in said City.

SECTION 4. The City Council of the City of Austin hereby orders that at least thirty days notice of the special election herein ordered shall be given in the manner required by the applicable provisions of the laws of the State of Texas and the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Austin, Texas, with respect generally to special elections in said City. The notice to be given shall be as follows:

"NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS, CONCERNING THE ADOPTION OF A CERTAIN RESOLUTION PURSUANT TO THE URBAN RENEWAL LAW OF THE STATE OF TEXAS. "

Pursuant to the applicable provisions of the laws of the State of Texas and the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Austin, including particularly, the Urban Renewal Law of the State of Texas (Article 1269 1-3, Vernon's Annotated Civil Statutes of Texas), notice is hereby given that a special election will be held in said City on the 5th day of December, 1959, from 7:00 A. M. to 7:00 P. M., to determine whether the City Council of said City shall adopt a resolution substantially as follows:

"RESOLUTION MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS, DETERMINATIONS, AND ELECTIONS UNDER AND PURSUANT TO THE URBAN RENEWAL LAW OF TEXAS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

SECTION 1. It is hereby found and determined that one or more slum or blighted areas exist in the City of Austin, Texas.

SECTION 2. It is hereby further found and determined that the rehabilitation, conservation, or slum clearance and redevelopment or a combination thereof, of such slum or blighted area or areas, is necessary in the interest of public health, safety, morals or welfare of the residents of said City. "

SECTION 3. It is hereby further determined that the City of Austin shall exercise the powers granted to the City by the Urban Renewal Law of the State of Texas, except the Urban Renewal Project powers as defined in said Urban Renewal Law.

SECTION 4. It is hereby further determined to be necessary and in the public interest that the City of Austin elect, and, accordingly, the City hereby elects to have said Urban Renewal project powers exercised by the Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Austin, which agency is created by said Urban Renewal Law.

Only legally qualified voters residing within the corporate limits of the City of Austin, Texas, owning taxable property within said corporate limits, who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall be entitled to vote at said special election.

The notice of said election shall be given by posting and publication of a copy of this election ordinance, together with the Notice of Election herein prescribed. Said notice shall be posted at the City Hall and at each voting place herein designated in each of the voting precincts in the City as required by law, and be published on the same day in The Austin American, a newspaper of general circulation, published in the City of Austin, Texas.

"OFFICIAL BALLOT FOR USE IN SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS, ON THE 5TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1959, CONCERNING THE ADOPTION OF A CERTAIN RESOLUTION PURSUANT TO THE URBAN RENEWAL LAW OF TEXAS.

SHALL the City Council of the City of Austin adopt a

Resolution substantially as follows?

"RESOLUTION MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS, DETERMINATIONS, AND ELECTIONS UNDER AND PURSUANT TO THE URBAN RENEWAL LAW OF TEXAS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

SECTION 1. It is hereby found and determined that one or more slum or blighted areas exist in the City of Austin, Texas.

SECTION 2. It is hereby further found and determined that the rehabilitation, conservation, or slum clearance and redevelopment or a combination thereof, of such slum or blighted area or areas, is necessary in the interest of public health, safety, morals or welfare of the residents of said City.

SECTION 3. It is hereby further determined that the City of Austin shall exercise the powers granted to the city by the Urban Renewal Law of the State of Texas, except the Urban Renewal project powers as defined in said Urban Renewal Law.

SECTION 4. It is hereby further determined to be necessary and in the public interest that the City of Austin elect, and, accordingly, the City hereby elects to have said Urban Renewal project powers exercised by the Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Austin, which agency is created by said Urban Renewal Law.

SECTION 5. The findings, determinations, and elections herein made are made in accordance with, and the various terms used herein are used in the same sense as used or defined in said Urban Renewal Law."

That the public importance of this measure constitutes an emergency and an imperative public necessity that this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon its passage for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Austin, Texas, and all Ordinance and Charter rules governing the effective date of any ordinance are hereby suspended and this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its final passage, and it is so ordained.
