Kitten Season Surges On

May was quite a busy month for us - we transferred out 362 kittens, placed 370 in foster homes, adopted out 120, and kept hundreds more in care at the shelter. Of the 98 cats who were humanely euthanized, 72 were displaying symptoms of severe illnesses such as feline leukemia, panleukopenia, renal failure, and upper respiratory infections along with symptoms of concomitant illnesses. Twenty-two more were hit by a car or suffering from similar trauma, and at least four others were a few days old, orphaned, and unable to survive. Despite the numerous health issues surrounding these vulnerable animals, we were able to provide a live outcome or temporary foster for the vast majority of them, including many who were ill or injured but still able to survive under our care. We expect next month to be just as a busy, and we anticipate the challenges it will bring.
