Jacqueline Cullom is an assistant city attorney with the City of Austin assigned to the Municipal Operations Division. Jacqueline has over twenty years of experience as a governmental attorney having served as legal counsel to Texas municipalities, counties, and all three branches of State government.

Jacqueline received her Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science from Texas State University. After graduating from St. Mary's University of Law in May, 1989, Jacqueline began her legal career with the Texas Supreme Court as a briefing attorney with Justice Lloyd Doggett. She served as a staff attorney to the Senate State Affairs Committee during the 72nd Legislative Session, and later as staff attorney to the Texas Department of Commerce (currently the Economic Development Office of the Texas Governor's Office), and special counsel to the Public Utility Commission.

Jacqueline was appointed as the first in-house city attorney by the New Braunfels City Council in 1994 and during that time was appointed to the Attorney General's Municipal Advisory Committee. In 1998, she was appointed as Special Counsel by the Hays County District Attorney assigned to represent the Hays County Commissioners Court. Subsequently, she served a similar role in Bexar County. In each of these positions, Jacqueline was the primary attorney responsible for compliance with the Texas Open Meetings Act and the Texas Public Information Act.

Jacqueline has two daughters, Kathryn, a Freshman at the University of Texas and Madison, a basketball star at Navarro Junior High.
