




Capital Improvement Investment Needs

FY17 Rolling Needs Assessment

Category	Unfunded Need
Creek Flood (Top 20*)	\$ 418M
Localized Flood (Top 20*)	\$ 161M
Water Quality	\$ 150M
Multi-Mission	\$ 71M
Asset Management	\$ 1,142M

Estimated \$1.94 Billion CIP Needs



^{*}FY17 unfunded need estimates reflects top 20 problem areas only – subset of much larger need.

Capital Improvement Program Funding Outlook

- Existing CIP appropriations
- Continue current rate of annual CIP transfer
- If approved by voters, \$112 million bond for drainage and flood risk reduction projects

Over 10 years \$500+ million



FY19 Budget: CIP Appropriations

- Over \$37M towards 53 capital projects
 - 10 new projects
 - -43 ongoing projects requesting funding in FY19

Little Walnut Creek – Jamestown Dr Stream Stabilization and Storm Drain Improvements

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


Boggy Creek – Hwy 183 to Delwau Ln Channel Stabilization




Citywide — General Stormwater Infrastructure Maintenance Projects Parent Account


Active and Completed Capital Projects (2001 – Present)
