

PRIORITY 1

Imminent Danger/Life-Safety Response: 1 hour

- Evacuation/Displacements
- Structural Failure
- Emergency Responses
- EOC Activated/Natural Disaster

High-Risk Hazard/Time Sensitive Response: 24 hours

- Special Events: Temporary Structures, Over Occupancy and Blocked Egress
- Open/Accessible Dangerous Buildings & Pool
- Potentially Dangerous Nuisances
- Occupied Substandard Conditions With Reported Gas, Plumbing, Electrical and Structural Failures
- Short-Term Rentals


