RULES FOR FOOD DONATIONS



- <u>Pre-packaged foods:</u> that are non-potentially hazardous (cans of soup, boxes
 of cereal, bottled water) may be collected for donation and distributed without a
 permit. Some restrictions also apply for expired or damaged foods.
- <u>Potentially Hazardous Foods:</u> Other foods are considered *Potentially Hazardous* due to health considerations. The donation of these foods must meet certain criteria, and for donations within Travis County, they require a permit application from the Austin/Travis County Health and Human Services Department.
- **Labeling:** Donated foods must be labeled to include: name of the item/food, date the food was prepared manufacturer information, list of ingredients.

Foods that may NOT be donated:

- Damaged: Canned foods that are heavily dented; packaged foods without a complete source/manufacturer label.
- **Distressed:** Foods exposed to fire, flooding, excessive heat, smoke, other environmental contamination, etc.
- Previous Service: Foods that have been previously served to a consumer.
- Home Prepared: No home prepared potentially hazardous foods can be donated for human consumption.
- Shelf Life: Foods that are potentially hazardous must not be used past the shelf life expiration date.

REMINDER: Animals are Prohibited in Food Establishments.

Except for service animals that are controlled by the disabled employee or person, or service animals in training when accompanied by an approved trainer.
