Altars in the Zócalo:

 There is no size limit for the outdoor altars. Your imagination is the limit!

 Participants must provide their own bases.
The ESB-MACC is unable to provide pedestals or tables.

Duplicates of photographs and documents are encouraged as the altars will be publicly displayed outside. Non-perishables, non-valuables, and battery operated candles are acceptable to include in your altar.

 Some common objects on an altar include photographs, candles, cempasúchil (marigolds), papel picado, pan de muerto, sugar skulls, and other items the departed personally enjoyed.
