Bike tour will visit Blackshear Community Garden, Greater Mount Zion Baptist Church Garden, Good Soil Community Garden, Homewood Heights Community Garden, Boggy Creek Farm, and will culminate at Festival Beach Community Garden.



#### Interested in starting a community garden on city-owned land, such as a park?

The City of Austin has made it a priority to support urban agriculture because of its ability to provide nutritious food, promote sustainability, reduce energy needs, contribute to food security, and support the local economy. The Sustainable Urban Agriculture & Community Garden (SUACG) program was created to help Austinites gain access to city-owned land to start community gardens.

In order to start a garden on city land, you must get an "endorsement" from the SUACG program. The following items are required to apply to become an endorsed community garden program and obtain a City of Austin Garden Permit:

Written description of the proposed garden, including why the particular site has been identified and what the mission of the garden is in relationship to community needs
List of steering committee members and their contact information as well as a list of committed gardeners (minimum of four)
Design sketch for the garden, to include location and size of all trees in garden area
Garden By-laws or Rules
Sample contract or membership agreement for individual gardeners
Project Timeline, including steps taken to date
Budget & Fundraising Plan for first year
Sponsoring nonprofit (often the Sustainable Food Center!), demonstrated by a letter of support or memorandum of understanding
Letter of support from Neighborhood Association that contains the garden site
Letters of endorsement from neighbors (owners and renters) and key stakeholders (e.g. schools, churches, park users)



#### **HOW SUACG CAN HELP YOU START A GARDEN:**

#### Community Garden Assistance provided by SUACG program:

- City of Austin land availability search
- garden endorsement (and subsequent AWU water tap installation fee waiver) for both private gardens and gardens on City land
- water tap application assistance
- sealed engineer-drawn water tap plan (required by AWU for water tap installation) -> we have \$10K for this through an NRPA grant
- site plan review and meeting with relevant City departments and staff
- site plan exemption permit assistance with Development Assistance Center for site development (fences up to 6 feet and sheds/buildings up to 120 square feet do not require a permit, and agriculture does not require a permit)
- tree permit for construction in critical root zone through Development Assistance Center
- utility permit for gardens on City land (through AULCC)
- License Agreement assistance for City land (through Austin Transportation Dept.)
- rainwater harvesting methods and assistance through Development Assistance Center
- information on edible trees and plants for landscaping
- information and guidance on wildlife habitat at community gardens
- provide information for other garden resources (Sustainable Food Center, Urban Patchwork, Green Corn Project, etc.)
- Promotion/organization of garden-related events
  - -Garden grand openings/workdays
  - -Food Day Oct. 24<sup>th</sup> and Garden Bike Tour Oct. 25<sup>th</sup>
  - -Zilker Garden Fest Mar. 28-29, 2015
