Dear Visual Artist:

The Art Gallery at the Old Bakery & Emporium (OBE) is currently seeking applications for the Art Gallery for exhibits January 2014 through December 2014. We invite artists and visual arts organizations to apply. Exhibitors must be 50 years of age or older to meet OBE consignors requirements.

Notifications will be sent in October with further information.

The Old Bakery & Emporium is a charming historic building located in the heart of downtown Austin, across from the State Capitol. The Art Gallery is located on the 3rd floor of the OBE and is managed by the City of Austin Parks and Recreation Department. The building operates as a gift emporium that features diverse and unique handcrafts by local artisans 50 or older. In addition, the Bakery houses the Lundberg-Maerki Historical Collection, Art Gallery and visitor information center.

Our ultimate objective is to have entertaining and interesting art exhibitions for our visitors and to highlight senior artists in the community. The Art Gallery is approximately 140 linear feet of wall space. The rotating monthly schedule of exhibitions features artwork of all media and subject matter. Criteria for selection includes artistic merit as evidenced by the submitted materials and appropriate subject matter for the public.

There is **no fee** to submit a proposal, but there will be a 20% commission from all art sold during the exhibit. Applicants may specify a preference of month, however, months and times of each exhibit will be assigned by the jury panel.
