

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Overview

This document is a tool to assist in the organization of community engagement and stakeholder groups for the Carver ATX Phase II Planning. The stakeholders are defined as the various groups who will be affected by the project – directly or indirectly, including various organizations and prominent community members. The efforts to facilitate effective and diverse community outreach strategy, stakeholder participation, input collection and analysis, and presentation of the materials will be led by a team consisting of a consortium of Smith & Company Architects and Perkins and Will in collaboration with the City Project Manager and PARD's Communication and Engagement Office. The team employs a variety of community engagement tools to achieve implementable plans and successful outcomes and have tailored the process outlined in this document to fit the specific needs of this project. The Plan is intended to serve as a blueprint for public involvement and is designed to allow flexibility in its implementation as the project evolves. The end goal is to create a plan that all parties are involved with. It outlines:

- 1. Methods we will employ to engage the community to gather requisite data and information.
- 2. The proposed tools, resources, and timeline to be used for outreach.

Project Background

The George Washington Carver Museum, Cultural and Genealogy Center (Carver Museum) is a facility of historical and cultural heritage for the city of Austin.

Originally, a 1600 square foot facility, it has grown to incorporate a multi-facility campus for a 'Living Museum' immersed in African American history, culture, and life. In 2000, a three-phase expansion program was proposed because of a feasibility study. Out of the three proposed phases, only the first phase has been implemented while the second and third phases are yet to be addressed. The City of Austin Parks and Recreation Department (PARD) wishes to revisit and review the improvements that were proposed previously for phases two and three and develop a new plan that is in line with current requirements. The objective of this project is to develop a master plan update that takes into consideration the site's current usage and changes to the surrounding area. The Public Outreach and Engagement Plan will help inform the planning, design and development of the facility that reflects the community's current sensibilities.

The master plan may include the following:

- Assessment of existing site conditions
- Assessment of existing building conditions
- Expansion needs for programming and/or support facilities
- Landscape master plan
- Parking analysis
- Pedestrian and vehicular circulation
- Other pertinent considerations based on community feedback

Stakeholder and community feedback addressing the above issues will be collected to aid and assist with the process.

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Goals and Objectives of the Engagement Process

The goals of engagement will be as follows:

1. Education - Engagement activities shall result in key stakeholders being more informed about the Carver Museum facility, operations, and services, the Master Plan Update and process.

2. Diverse stakeholder representation - There will be representation of diverse groups of stakeholders including but not limited to Carver Museum users, area residents, area businesses, groups and organizations that serve a similar population, longtime and former residents who may not may not continue to live here but are rooted to the community, artist groups.

3. Consultation – Engagement activities are designed in a way that gathers input from stakeholders to inform the plan. At the end of each meeting, the team will summarize ways by which the inputs will be used in the master-planning process.

4. Conclusive – Each engagement will be designed to get specific information from the stakeholders on aspects pertaining to the Carver Museum and its surroundings. These are intended to be directive and help guide the master plan.

Public Participation Principles

The carver Center Master Plan will be implemented in accordance with the City of Austin's Public Participation Principles:

- 1. Accountability and Transparency The team will enable the public to participate in decision-making processes by providing clear information on the issues, ways to participate, and how their participation contributes to the decision.
- 2. Fairness & Respect The team will maintain a safe environment that cultivates and supports respectful public engagement and will expect participants to do so in turn.
- Accessibility The team will respect and encourage participation by providing ample public notice of opportunities and resources and accommodations that enable all to participate.
- Predictability & Consistency The team will prepare the public to participate by providing meeting agendas, discussion guidelines, notes, and information on next steps.
- 5. Creativity & Community Collaboration (Inclusivity and Diversity) The team will use innovative, proven, and customized engagement solutions that are appropriate to the needs of the projects and the participants.
- 6. Stewards of Resources The team will balance its commitment to provide ample opportunities for public involvement with its commitment to delivering government services efficiently and using City resources wisely.

Schedule

Note: All meeting timelines are tentative based on the changing COVID 19 situation and the meetings will be modified or rescheduled in compliance and coordination with City of Austin policies and recommendations.

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Stakeholders will be engaged throughout the process, but specifically at seven major touchpoints – TAG meetings (4) and Community meetings (3). In addition to this, numerous smaller group conversations with key stakeholders shall be conducted to gather required information. The following pages provide preliminary details for each event. A general explanation of each event is described here:

- Technical Advisory Group Meetings (or TAG) (June'20-Apr'21): The focus of these meetings will be to engage, inform the committee of the plan and rely upon the group members to ensure that the Carver Museum and their respective department's goals, policies, plans, and constraints are understood and considered during the planning process. The team will engage with the TAG group at multiple stages.
- 2. **Community Meetings (June'20-Nov'20):** Three community meetings will be conducted to engage, inform the public of the project and to gather community input and recommendations at various stages of the planning and design process. These will also be available online through PARD's channels to ensure accessibility to people who are unable to attend the meetings.
- 3. **Small Group Conversations (Apr'30-Jun'20):** Conduct small-scale, group meetings with PARD identified stakeholder groups to garner detailed information regarding programming, expansion needs, infrastructure, transportation, neighborhood connectivity, environmental concerns, and any other relevant issues affecting the development of the identified area.
- 4. Core Team Meetings (throughout the duration of the project): Core Team meetings will be held throughout the duration of the project. Weekly touchpoints will be established to track the progress of the project along with check points before and after community meetings to ensure all the comments have been acknowledged and incorporated. The Core Team will provide advice and input to ensure the plan is consistent with the mission of the project, the plan's guiding principles, and long-term vision, and to ensure that the various stakeholder groups and their concerns are addressed in the plan. The Core Team will advise and give recommendations to the project and leadership team. The team will foster openness and inclusion in the planning process through dialogue and communication with all stakeholders. This is to ensure meaningful representation of the stakeholder groups throughout the planning process.



Additional Engagement

1. The team will aid PARD and provide survey materials and questions to use on online platforms such as Speak Up Austin, surveys, and social media.

2. The team will also provide the required materials to conduct Intercept surveys - designed to quickly gain input from 'walk-up' facility users.

3. Assist in preparation of PARD notifications on upcoming public meetings (6-8 weeks in advance), boards, commissions, City Council, including monthly project updates. Press releases shall be reviewed and disseminated by the PARD Communication and Engagement Office.

Documentation of Public Process

1. The team will prepare and maintain a contact list of stakeholders and interested parties for record keeping, consultation, and notification purposes.

2. The team will prepare and maintain every meeting presentation and all meeting materials, sign-in sheets, and meeting minutes. Provide to the City or PARD for posting on website within 48 hours. Meeting material will also be included in an appendix of the final plan.

3. The team will maintain every piece of public feedback, including feedback from meetings, online surveys, emails and phone calls, to be documented in an appendix of the final plan.

- 1. Idea of the Carver:
 - Treat Carver like one unified entity

D.1 Facilities & Site Assessment Presentation



INTRO

The George Washington Carver Museum, Cultural and Genealogy Center (Carver Museum) is dedicated to the collection, preservation, research, interpretation and exhibition of historical and cultural materials reflecting all dimensions of experiences of persons of African descent living in Austin, Travis County, and in the United States. The museum is also a key source of information on the history and celebration of Juneteenth.

The Carver Museum is currently housed in a 36,000 square-foot facility that includes four galleries, a conference room, classroom, darkroom, dance studio, 134-seat theatre, and archival space. The galleries feature a core exhibit on African American History, a permanent exhibit on Austin African-American families, an Artists' Gallery, and a children's exhibit on African-American scientists and inventors. Other programming includes theater rental, education programs, summer camps and genealogy programs.

The Carver Museum began with a community desire to upgrade the original 1600sf facility and create a multi-facility campus for a "Living Museum" that would be immersed in African American experience, culture, history and traditions. In 1985, a survey of the community confirmed the desire to improve the Carver Museum, and in 1986 an initial feasibility study was conducted. In 1998, bond funding was approved for the Carver Museum expansion. In 2000, a Feasibility Study for the Expansion of the George Washington Carver Museum & Cultural Center was conducted, and a 3-phase building program was developed. The phase 1 development outlined in this study was opened in 2005. The expansion included a lobby with reception, lecture hall/theater, classrooms, dance studio, dark room, conference room, commercial kitchen, storage, outdoor plazas and expanded parking.

Today, the Carver Museum is facing growth challenges with a new desire to expand programming and events. The 2000 Feasibility Study outlined Phase 2 and 3 improvements that have not been realized. Some of these planned future improvements include a museum store, recording studio, outdoor concessions, choir/vocal studio, new education building, new theater and additional parking. The City desires a review of these proposed elements, current programming, revenue generation, facility condition and capacity and current community desire to develop a new Carver Museum master plan to meet the community needs of today.



Q&A

Chivas Watson

- How will the parking serve the Library/Museum and not disparage the Rosewood community in general?
- He agrees that additional parking is needed, but will the parking structure serve only the Carver Complex, or will
 it serve the area as public parking?
- Greg mentioned it will be a challenge to serve as public parking but is a good question that need to be addressed.

Lee Sherman

- Is the SW corner not buildable due to utilities or??
- Kenneth mentioned that no large trees or significant structures may be planned there due to the main power line that runs through the site, that is why we are proposing that corner for the June 19th Plaza, if it did not have these power lines it would be a great corner for additions.

Ronda Jones

• She loves the new location of the Juneteenth Plaza

Bob Cervi

- What happened to the public restrooms in option 3?
- > The restrooms will be relocated inside the Educational Building

Greg Montes

- How will the "stand alone" buildings connect to the main building? Would it be a big problem architecturally speaking?
- Engineering of alignment would not be a big deal on most additions, the only challenges would be connecting the gallery roof in Option 1 and probably the theater addition because of the slope of the site, but changing the elevator shaft location will work.
- In general, we should not have major problems or challenges integrating the new wings into the existing main building.

Stephen Coulston

- Do "freestanding" buildings work from an operational perspective?
- Carre: "The Gallery would not work as a separate building as they need a consolidated space for exhibitions and events. The same goes for the Theater. While a "stand alone" educational building would bring benefits from the operational perspective to the complex".

2

Terry D. Smith

- Do we agree not to present an option with all the program pieces being consolidated into a single building with no additions to the existing building?
- Laura: "We don't get the benefit of expansion of our Museum/Gallery spaces of Theater/Reception space without adding to the existing building. The addition that respects the arc of the existing building seems quite appropriate".

Laura Esparza

- She thinks the staff will like Option 3 with the Educational Program Building separate from the main building.
- She likes Option 1: the shape of the courtyard, the protectiveness of the space, she thinks it is a very elegant concept. She would only like to add the Juneteenth Plaza in the SW corner of the site and bring the parking structure to the south.

Carre Adams

- Statuary should be considered in a green area rather than on a concrete platform.
- Carre does not think the majority of the community would ask for a separate building with no additions to the existing building.
- Within these three options, which would be the most expensive and the least expensive?
- Option 3 would be the most expensive for having the education building as a 'freestanding' building but Option 1 could be close by the preservation of the tree and the integration of the gallery roofs.
 Option 2 would be the least expensive, but we must consider the relocation of the major utilities' lines, which could equal the cost of the previous options even up to being higher.
 We cannot give a final answer until we receive an accurate feedback from our Cost Estimator.

Q&A

John Daniels (APL):

- Option 3 allows direct access to facility operations; option 2 loses access. We must maintain that service area for drop-off of service trucks (small trucks only, no tractor trailers).
- The new parking structure should be treated as a piece of art and complement the existing mural.
- The Juneteenth Plaza should be renamed or relocated; the size is not adequate for the celebrations that the plaza hosts. It needs to have a larger presence.
 - > The entire site will be "huge park" to celebrate the culture and history of the community.

Lee Sherman (Watershed Protection)

- Keep in mind that a pretty serious utility relocation will be needed.
- For underground ponds, a different type of maintenance not offered by the City will be required, so you will have to consider hiring a third-party specialist.

Bob Cervi (AISD)

- Coordination of construction with the school calendar will be required for the relocation of public services since the parking lot of this facility will be affected.
- The possibility that Kealing could share the underground pond with Carver would have to be analyzed, mainly by the distance between them.
- I support the idea that the parking structure can be a storyteller and a complement to the plaza.

Kerri Thompson (PARD)

- What are you planning to do with the outdoor public restrooms?
 - > The idea is to redevelop and scale them to accommodate big events.

NEXT STEPS

- 1. Community Meeting #3 November 21, 2020
- 2. Feedback from consultants, city staff and community meeting #3 will be incorporated to define the final option.
- 3. This final option must be finalized during the spring to be presented to the City staff, Boards, Commissions and Council Review for approval.





2. Toss: The participants were asked what they appreciate the least or dislike the most about the Carver?

The replies elaborated on various issues:

e) Way finding:

The participants conveyed that the grounds lacked lighting and security.

f) Parking and Accessibility:

Wheelchair access from the lower parking lot to the Carver is not easy and needs improvement.

The walk from the parking lot to the museum is long for senior citizens who do not feel comfortable especially when its dark.

The participants suggested including Accessible Parking on the street in front of the Carver.

g) Design and utilization:

The participants felt that the Carver lacked porousness between the interior and exterior spaces and could do with some physical connection to the landscape.

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The kitchen is too small for large events, is over-utilized and the participants elaborated on the importance of food in celebrations at the Carver.

The Carver does not have enough wall space for temporary displays.

Some of the participants felt that the theater is not sized appropriately and should be re-designed to accommodate events of all sizes.

The Carver auditorium lacks a proper 'green room'.

The acoustics in 'the drum' is challenging when there are many people and needs to be updated in the redesign.


The Carver at present lacks storage space and unable to store all the tables and chairs needed for the various events and gatherings.

The replies can be categorized as follows:

h) <u>Ideas:</u>

The participants suggested that the Carver should present itself as a space that celebrates all types of art.

The Carver consists of spaces that speaks to the history of the community.

i) Way finding and Accessibility:

The participants suggested improving signage and way finding throughout the facility.

A digital marquee could also be placed at the front of the building to inform people of the events happening in the facility.

Within the museum, the participants identified the need for better signage to direct visitors. This could be coupled with an automatic introduction of the facility and its displays the moment one enters the building.





The replies covered multiple concerns:

a) Spaces in the building:

- The participants conveyed that the Carver was accessible to people with special needs both as audience and participants.

- c) <u>Maintenance:</u> • The p
 - The participants felt that the theater lacks a designated professional technician to manage sound and lighting
- d) Design and utilization:
 - The theater lacks adequate seating capacity due to which organizers of events either must break up performances or move them to other venues.
 - The stage is not deep enough for certain types of performances.
 - The loading docks, located behind the stage, is under-utilized, and should be used for storage and staging in a better way.
 - The pre-function area (hallway) is too small at present.
 - Participants conveyed that there is noise bleed between the studios and theater. This is unfavorable if there is a performance in the theater at the same time.
 - The incline of the theater is steep and presents unfavorable accessibility for some of the audience. For others, the incline feels precarious.

The replies elaborated on various issues:

- e) Way finding:
 - The Carver complex lacks adequate wayfinding and signage. It needs a signifier to enable instant recognition in the area.
 - Safety is a concern.
- f) Parking and Accessibility:
 - Participants indicated that they often felt unsafe during nighttime around the Carver on account of the lack of lighting in the complex. The parking lots set the tone for the Carver and are not well lit.
 - Park space between the school and Carver could use better lighting and other maintenance and wayfinding related improvements

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g) Design and utilization:

- Exhibit hall not large enough, need space for more elaborate exhibits.
- The Carver museum needs well designed spaces for high quality travelling exhibits.
- Participants conveyed that the Carver lacked adequate meeting space on account of which they currently end up meeting in spaces that are not setup appropriately.
- Theater is very steep and poses a hindrance to accessibility.

- The location of the kitchen is not great for renters. A support space adjacent to the main kitchen to store/wheel stuff around would be useful.
- Leaks in the ceiling.
- Renters often must do makeshift set-up for fabrication.
- Archive needs proper tools and storage.
- The ventilation system in the basement make a disruptive squeaking noise whenever the AC is turned on.
- The open space to the rear of the building lacks proper landscaping, maintenance and upkeep and oftentimes becomes a collector of overflowing water.
- Reception desk within The Drum is not well designed aesthetically and functionally.
- Office space and storage is not adequate. Things often spill out. The Carver needs to have more room for things like tool cart (storage near areas to support their uses)
- Loading dock onramp and maneuvering are circuitous.
- The darkroom is not used much at present and the new design should increase usability of this space.
- Bathrooms lighting is poor, difficult for maintenance (great barometer for comfort / emotion in a building)
- The employee break room should be spacious. At present, the door does not fully open due to lack of space.

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

- Separate artist's studio spaces (3 spaces) to house resident artists. These could be dedicated spaces for the artists even after the facility closes.
- Need a green roof.
- Drum is beautiful but awkwardly shaped. Its not conducive to house the various events. Oftentimes, this space is blocked by event rentals.
- Amphitheater to accommodate outdoor programs.
- Patio and seating area to be designed.
- "Can the hallway wall of windows be extended to create a ballroom?"
- Accessing the restrooms from the outside should be made easier. Events in the outdoor area may require people to access indoor spaces/restrooms and it is very difficult with the current design of the Carver.
- Create a campus separate the cultural facility from the museum.
- Purpose built shades in the outdoor spaces freedom walk, etc.
- Maintain and incorporate better ADA compliance.
- Accessibility improvements from the parking lot to the museum.
- "Maybe we have an interior courtyard?"
- If we are to accommodate more exhibits (rotating and permanent), the Carver would require additional space of around 10,000sq.ft.
- Gallery space can be used by performing artists as well.

Notes:

- 1. **New buildings to not obstruct existing buildings:** Participants mentioned that the parking garage shouldn't obstruct the existing building. The garage will have a floor to floor height of 10ft and 3-4 levels; this will not obstruct the existing building.
- 2. **Challenges to connect new additions to existing building:** The design team assured the Commissioners that the challenges are not insurmountable.
- 3. **Phasing/Time period of construction:** This would depend on the availability of funds from COA. The team recognizes that the sequencing of renovations to interiors will have to be synchronized with construction activities outside. Team to ensure that the sequencing of activities to cause least disruption to the museum.
- 4. **Improvements to Existing Structure:** Commissioners brought up the issue of leaking roof in the existing building. Design team suggested developing a building envelope evaluation report that will inform the next steps.
- 5. **Expansion Strategies:** Commissioners mentioned expansion should happen in one flow. 'We do not want to start and stop'. Whatever option is chosen, should enable a continuous flow in the same design style.
- 6. Next Steps: Technical consultants will inform further design details and cost estimates
- 7. Comments on the Design Options:
 - Opt 2 & 3: Location of Juneteenth plaza at the corner is powerful; idea of campus development works well.
 - Concerns on placement of Juneteenth Plaza in front of the mural; new additions should not impede the existing
 - Opt 1: Liked the courtyard; concerns raised about the placement of Juneteenth monument in front of the building since some of the statues will get lost when placed in front/between buildings.
 - All options address the need for additional space well
 - Opt 3: Some of the commissioners preferred this. Suggested capturing rainwater; can help reduce utility expenses; include more trees (peach, pecan)
 - Commissioners suggested collaborating with library and Kealing during the planning process
 - Pool: Since the pool is unused today, the design can eliminate the pool and use that land instead
 - Drainage: Concerns raised on increased overflow of water due to new buildings. The design team assured that new developments will happen in tandem with re-designing land and drainage patterns; ensuring water is drained to the detention pond.
 - Materials: Commissioners raised questions on the material palette of the new development. Team assured that the new materials chosen will respect the museum and its expression today. Any addition will acknowledge the existing.
 - Commissioners suggested that the design team present the options to the AARAC soon.



1. How do you intend to integrate black history in this project?

- There was a lot of discussion about identification, how to reconnect those young African American communities back with Carver.
- The permanent gallery will be dedicated to African American history
- This space has a very specific mission, it is devoted to the celebration of the preservation of African American culture.
- A space that speaks about African Americans in Austin and in the US.
- We are partners with the Library and the Genealogy Center in this project since the entire complex has been designed to provide a space for the African American community to attend and get together.

2. Is the food truck area being considered as a temporary space or as a permanent space where business opportunities can be offered to local merchants?

- This space will be defined during the design phase, but so far it is intended to be a flexible space.
- During our meeting with AARAC, the idea of implementing business for the African American community on the garage level was brought to the table. We believe it is an excellent idea that we will try to incorporate into the expansion plan.

3. Site: How can we get there? How is the pedestrian experience in the outdoor spaces? Pros and cons at the micro and macro level.

- There is already a bus stop at the corner of Rosewood Ave. and Angelina St.
- Parking is very important. Setting up the garage was a great challenge, we had to do several studies and we decided to propose a building on Rosewood Ave. for its easy access and connection with the museum and the library. In addition, the building will serve as a piece of art for the neighborhood.
- From a micro level, our biggest issue was the relocation of the existing facilities.
- From a macro level, Rosewood Ave. is already a pedestrian street. There is an existing bus stop at Rosewood Ave. and Angelina St. We would like to add more bike routes and rental stations.

4. How was the community engagement process?

- With the pandemic, we had to migrate all meetings to virtual meetings ... that must have been the most challenging issue at the beginning of the process. But fortunately, the results were extremely positive, so we have thought about integrating the virtual meetings as an additional option for future projects.
- With virtual meetings, we were able to reach people we don't normally reach during in-person meetings.
- During the small group meetings (Task Force, Ambassadors, AARAC, Performing Arts, Visual Artists, Historians, Civil Leaders, CoA Staff, Carver Staff), we managed to have a great connection and closeness with most of the attendees.

NOTES

- One suggestion would be to add more shaded spaces for pedestrians and integrate outdoor spaces with pathways and visual connections.
- They like the idea of getting back the corner of Rosewood Ave. and Angelina St. to the community.
- Some traffic concerns as all streets are single lane in both directions.
- They all agree that they really like the project.

1. Any concerns removing the Kealing Pool?

• We did not hear any concerns from the community regarding the pool. The most important comment from the community is their desire to get enough funds to see this project built as well as the impact that the garage could have on the neighborhood, but when explaining that this building, in addition to covering the need for parking, will serve as an art space, they accepted the idea of this new building.

2. Funding:

- There is still some money left from the 2018 Bond, \$ 7.5 million was allocated for Carver's renovations and expansion. \$ 2M was assigned for near-completion parking lot improvements. \$ 1.5M was allocated for theater improvements and ADA. We have a remaining balance of \$ 4M to be allocated to Phase 1 of the expansion plan.
- We will look for any available PODs and any other source of funding. Having the complete expansion plan will help to get more resources more easily.

3. Have you considered using the upper level of the parking garage for events?

• No, but it's a great idea to discuss in the design phase.

4. What about the north parking lot?

• It's going to stay; this parking lot Is shared with the school so we would like to keep it intact.

5. Kealing playground stays?

- We do not have many details; this space deserves an intense study during the design phase.

7. More bicycle parking and rental facilities are needed.

- This issue has already been discussed with the design commission and we will ensure that the pedestrians, bicycles, and transit connectivity is integrated into the plan.
- 8. Any concerns about natural elements and biodiversity?
- There is a detention pond to the south of the site that will remain to enhance the site and we also have an extensive landscape plan that will be included in the final report.

NOTES

- AARAC members are really focused on getting this project built, they don't want to wait another 9 years to see the project finished. They plan to send a Memo to the Council expressing their desire to receive more funds to complete this project in a much shorter time frame.
- Board Member Rinaldi made a motion to recommend to the City Council the adoption of the George Washington Carver Museum, Cultural & Genealogy Center Facility Expansion Plan; Vice Chair DePalma seconded the motion. The motion passed on a vote of 9-0 with Board Members Farasat and Morgan absent.

I do think that both are important and I think there's a way both could co-exist, albeit the vision for the Carver museum would have to be really clear. That's okay! I think that having museum exhibitions support cultural programming or vice versa only bolsters the unique value of the museum to a changing Austin. 
