



This profile summarizes the current conditions of streets, sidewalk network, urban trails, and Safe Routes to Schools program.



District 6 includes approximately 10% of all residential streets (327 lane miles) maintained by the Public Works Department. The category "No Condition Data" represents data anomalies from database transfers and data processing. These anomalies will be fully accounted for upon updating the Pavement Management Database.

The average number of residential sidewalks for all districts is 108 miles. District 6 includes 16% of the residential sidewalk network, or 170 miles. The Sidewalk Master Plan has identified 1.2 miles of High Priority sidewalk needs in District 6.

District 6 does not currently have any Urban Trails, but the Urban Trails Master Plan has identified the (CapMetro) Red Line Trail as a priority and 1.6 miles of that trail is within District 6.

The Safe Routes to Schools program serves 8 schools and 2 schools with crossing guard positions remain to be filled in District 6. The Safe Routes to Schools program is reported by the location of the schools, and students may live in different districts or outside of the district boundaries.

Note that all numbers above, except the Safe Routes to Schools Program, are estimates produced by geospatial data processing and are to be used as guides only.
