




Public Works Department District 9 Profile

District 9 includes approximately 9% of all residential streets maintained by the Public Works Department. The category "No Condition Data" represents data anomalies from database transfers and data processing. These anomalies will be fully accounted for upon updating the Pavement Management Database.

The average number of residential sidewalks for all districts is 108 miles. District 9 includes 6% of the residential sidewalk network, or 64 miles. The Sidewalk Master Plan has identified 9.4 miles of Very High Priority and 48 miles of High Priority sidewalk needs in District 9.

There are 31.3 miles of existing Urban Trails throughout Austin. District 9 has 4.5 miles of existing Urban Trails, including the Boardwalk at Lady Bird Lake, Roy and Ann Butler Trail, Johnston Creek Trail, Enfield Trail Connection, and portions of the Shoal Creek Trail. The Urban Trails Master Plan has identified 4 miles of priority trails in District 9, including portions of the Shoal Creek Trail and the (CapMetro) Red Line Trail.

The Safe Routes to Schools program serves 6 schools in District 9. The Safe Routes to Schools program is reported by the location of the schools, and students may live in different districts or outside of the district boundaries.

Note that all numbers above, except the Safe Routes to Schools Program, are estimates produced by geospatial data processing and are to be used as guides only.
