Austin Water's Downtown Reclaimed Water Transmissions Projects are currently in the design phase. You are receiving this letter because you are the resident or owner of a property along the route of these reclaimed projects. Come find out about these exciting new projects, how they will affect you, and how reclaimed water can be utilized on your property.

What is Reclaimed Water?

Reclaimed water is highly treated wastewater that is ordinarily discharged to the Colorado River. The Utility takes some of the water, stores it in tanks and pumps it to customers for non-drinking uses such as irrigation, cooling, toilet flushing and manufacturing. Using reclaimed water conserves our drinking water supply.

What are the downtown reclaimed water transmission projects?

The Capitol Complex Main Project will include the construction of 10,500 feet of reclaimed main. The project will start at Martin Luther King and Trinity streets. The main will continue south along Trinity to 11th Street and then head west along 11th and 10th streets terminating at San Antonio Street.

The 2nd Street Project will include the construction of 1,200 feet of reclaimed main. The project will connect into the reclaimed main being built with the Main to Junction 420 Project at the intersection of 2nd Street and San Antonio. The main will continue west along proposed 2nd Street and terminate at the Seaholm development.

The Main to Junction 420 Project will include 8,500 ft. of reclaimed mains. The project will start on West Street adjacent to ACC Rio Grande Campus. The main will continue south along West to 10th Street then head west along 10th Street to

Duncan park and east along 10th Street to San Antonio Street. At the intersection of 10th and San Antonio, the main will pick up where the Capitol Complex Project terminates and continue south along San Antonio and will end south of Lady Bird Lake at Auditorium Shores.

Who will the project serve?

All properties adjacent to the route of the transmission main will be provided a service for connection. Some of the properties adjacent to the alignment include the UT medical center, Waterloo Park, the Capitol Complex, various state office buildings, Wooldridge Park, the Travis County Office Complex, Republic Square, 3rd & 8th Street irrigation, Austin Community College (ACC) Rio Grande Campus, Seaholm development, Central Library, Green Development.

Why this route?

The route of the transmission main for the various projects in the downtown area was based on the system master plan, customer demand, minimizing traffic disruptions, impact on existing utilities, ease of maintenance and proposed light rail corridors.


