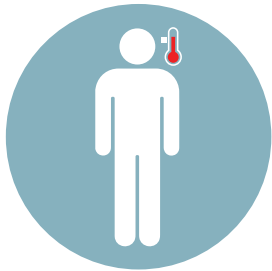


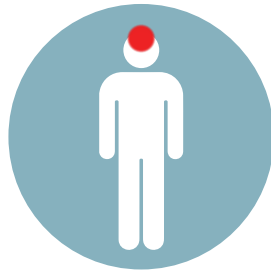
Symptoms of MPOX

Mpox is part of the same family of viruses as smallpox, but symptoms are milder and mpox is rarely fatal.

Symptoms can include:



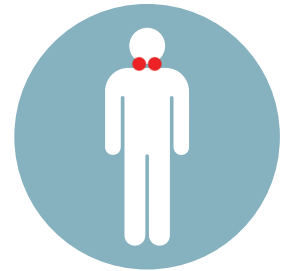
Fever



Headache



Muscle aches and backache



Swollen lymph nodes



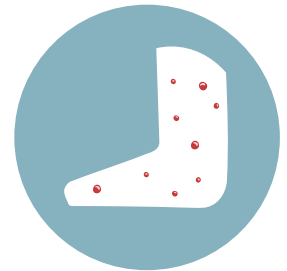
Chills



Exhaustion



A rash that can look like pimples or blisters that appears on the face, inside the mouth, and on other parts of the body, like the hands/palms, feet/soles of feet, chest, genitals, or anus.



A person has recovered only when the rash and scabs have gone away and there is a layer of new skin.
