Our Total Live Outcome Rate for Dogs was **92%** (92.90%)
Our Total Live Outcome Rate for Cats was **90%** (90.27%)

Notes About Animal Intakes

For April, we took in 25% more cats and dogs than during the same time last year. This increase was seen for all categories - kittens, puppies, cats, and dogs - and marks a significant reversal in the declining intake rates witnessed during 2010-2011. To help facilitate this spike in intake, we've placed twice as many animals in foster care than we did last year, increased the amount of neonatal animals we've transferred to rescue partners, and strived to maintain our adoption and return-to-owner rates.
