- It is a joint effort of the following offices of the Financial Services Department of the City:






The Checkbook

- The eCheckbook module of AFO provides the public (and many City staff) with an easily accessible way to look at payment activity.
- Most used selection is, no surprise, Payee.
- You'll also notice Payment and Payroll Register Reports, as well as breakdowns of the Top 5 Expense categories, and some graphic portrayals of information.
- Information is updated every Monday.



- Department
- Category *(A category is a high level grouping of expenses such as: Capital Equipment, Commodities/Other, Contractual Services, and Other)*
- **Payee** *(A payee is a vendor who provides goods or services and is paid by the City of Austin)*
- Expense Category *(An expense category describes the types of expenses. For example, Computer Software, Salaries, Surveying, Engineering, and Architectural Services)*
- **Payments Register** *(Prior Week Payments, Current Fiscal year To Date, Fiscal years 2011, 2012 & 2013)*





The Catalog

- The Contract Catalog – the “CAT” for short – is an (almost) complete list of the City’s currently active central purchase orders and Master (term) Agreements.
- Austin Energy activity is NOT provided due to competitive matters; however, Austin Energy orders and agreements are subject to Open Records.
- Most frequent access is via the Search, rather than the controls, which reflect the City’s competitive and non-competitive acquisitions.
- Like eCheckbook, data is refreshed every Monday.
- Many local jurisdictions use the CAT to see if there is an interlocal contracting opportunity. We also send an email updating contracts issued and expired in the past week.




- **Construction** (As of April 21, 2014, there are **181** contracts in this category, with a total authorization of **\$870,058,118.57** and a total Expenditure Amount of **\$553,161,396.15**)
- Commodities (Goods)

Budget & Finance

- The City of Austin fiscal year begins on October 1.
- In the Spring, the City begins the annual budget preparation process which includes opportunities for citizen participation and culminates with the adoption of a final budget in mid-September.
- Produced annually, the **CIP Plan** outlines the City's projected major capital improvements during the next five years based on reasonably anticipated revenues. The CIP Plan does not appropriate funds; rather it functions as a planning and budgeting tool that guides the annual development of the Capital Budget. The plan will also serve as a communication tool for the City's Capital Improvements Program to city management, City Council and the general public.
- The CIP Plan allows the City of Austin to appropriately plan for its current and future capital needs. Projects costs included in the plan are estimates and may change because of unforeseen circumstances. The CIP Plan is also structured to provide the City with flexibility so funds may be redirected elsewhere in the CIP if a project faces insurmountable obstacles or priorities change.

Factors Affecting the Capital Improvements Program

- Austin is challenged to maintain existing infrastructure while also making new investments
- The economic climate affects the cost of the capital program
- A rapidly growing Central Texas puts focus on regional planning efforts

Capital improvement projects may include construction and renovation of recreation centers and libraries, acquisition of parkland, repaving of streets, replacement of water and wastewater lines, provision of power for residents and the purchase of new fleet vehicles and IT networks.

Collectively, these projects are referred to as the Capital Improvements Program (CIP). CIP projects are varied, so some may require years of planning and construction while other may be completed in a shorter timeframe.

Key Principles for the City's Capital Investments

- Provide adequate infrastructure and facilities to maintain City services
- Seek cost-effective in planning and delivery
- Balance Community Priorities
- Support investments reflecting Imagine Austin vision and City Council policy directives
- Promote a sustainable community and high quality of life
- Encourage cross-departmental coordination and planning
- Abide by City financial policies

Vendor Connection

1. Vendor Connection provides a public clearinghouse to view detailed information about current business opportunities with the City of Austin.
2. This site allows vendors to create Subscriber accounts to subscribe to solicitations and download solicitation documents.
3. Vendors may also register to be notified of any new business opportunities based on commodity codes that they select.



Vendor Connection

- All of us have the following responsibilities with respect to vendors:
 - Identify potential (quality) sources
 - Collect and maintain key information for the purchasing and payment processes:
 - Legal name, tax id, business structure
 - Commodity Codes – goods and services – for sourcing
 - Sales Address with point of contact and methods – phone, fax, email
 - Payment Address
 - Collect and maintain varying types of M/W/DBE information, including sub-contracting payments external to the City's financial system.
- The City of Austin has to treat almost all interested parties as vendors – i.e. if you have an interested parties list or “bidders list”, you may still have to collect all this data because of LGC 176, Conflicts of Interest or similar statute.

 - Track solicitation activity;
 - Manage account data; and
 - View reports about their commercial relationship with the City

- We know that the single most important thing to a vendor is letting them know what business opportunities exist.
- The “home” page for a vendor is about solicitation activity:
