	The contractor or person doing the work has reviewed the approved plans and can ensure that the construction being inspected is consistent and ready for inspection. <i>UPC 105.2.3</i> Job address is posted in a visible location. <i>IBC 105.7</i> Contractor has a set of "approved plans," either electronic or paper, on site. <i>UPC 104.4</i> All fees shall have been paid, and there are no holds on the permit. <i>UPC 104.5</i> The temporary gas has been approved first, when applicable. <i>UPC 105.2.2</i> The permanent water meter is installed and operational. <i>IBC 111.3</i> Operational restrooms are complete in the area trying to acquire the TCO Occupancy. <i>IBC 111.3</i>
523 Stocking	
	All fees have been paid, and there are no holds on the permit. UPC 104.5
