1. Timeline of activities related to the establishment of the District: The consultant team developed a timeline of actions/activities taken by the City related to the establishment of the District. Participants noted that some of them had been deeply involved in these activities, but that there is an opportunity to update the timeline to incorporate different perspectives and a deeper understanding of the cultural and political events that have occurred in the establishment of the District. It was agreed the timeline would be sent out for review following the meeting

Case Study Discussion

Mend Collaborative presented a number of Districts throughout the country that could be examined to learn best practices. The following lists the Districts presented:

- 1. **5th Ward Cultural Arts District** Houston, TX
- 2. **7th Street** Oakland, CA
- 3. Albina Portland, OR
- 4. Jackson Ward Richmond, VA
- 5. Rondo St. Paul, MN
- 6. Sweet Auburn Atlanta, GA

The following summarizes the discussion of key aspects of the case studies that were mentioned as being of interest in the meeting:

- 1. **Highway Caps:** With the expansion of I-35, there is opportunity to explore other projects that have utilized these opportunities to receive land back, and expand opportunities to the other side of the interstate.
- 2. **Arts and History:** Arts and History have already been significant focuses in the District and could be further resourced.
- 3. **Small Business Development and Entrepreneurship:** Legacy businesses are important culture bearers in the neighborhood and expanding opportunities could be a strong focus of the District.
- 4. **Reparations, Right-of-Return & Down Payment Assistance:** Might be difficult to achieve in Texas. This can remain a goal, but should not be a priority.
- 5. **Americans for the Arts:** Coalition partners identified the Americans for the Arts organization for their research on districts and could be a resource for best practices and overall project examples.

Goals of the Cultural District

Discussion pivoted to establish goals for the cultural district. The following summarizes opportunities for the District:

- 150 Year Celebration: With the sesquicentennial celebrations in 2025 for Huston Tillotson University and Ebenezer Baptist Church, there is an opportunity to seek immediate impacts through street banners, concert events, markets, and more. This requires more funding for the district or collaboration within the District's community. City staff will begin coordination with departmental partners to seek solutions.
- 2. **District Placemaking:** Developing a wayfinding signage, banners, and more to highlight the historic and cultural features and organizations of the district. Signage would recognize and acknowledge what was here before. Developing

a consistent look through lighting improvements and fixtures. City is currently facilitating the development of a Heritage Wayfinding Manual that will be incorporated into the Strategic Planning process.

- 3. **Building the Community:** There is opportunity to develop a community center, build affordable housing, and expand upon the network of art and cultural venues. A specific goal includes putting this district on the national map for historic and cultural significance, but also for its ongoing art, music, and cultural production.
- 4. **Share the Stories:** There is an opportunity to record the history of this district through a documentary or even through new technology, mixed reality (XR). An XR experience could potentially share stories through a QR code tour, and offer an opportunity for the youth and College students in the area to gain experience and explore the future of storytelling while also learning about their local history. Such an opportunity would bring economic opportunity back to the District. There is also an opportunity to develop a local history curriculum to share in public schools.
