## **GUADALUPE ST. & LAVACA ST. TRANSIT IMPROVEMENTS** BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENTS


Austin Transportation Department, Capital Metro and the Corridor Program Office are collaborating to improve bus service on Lavaca Street and Guadalupe Street, one of the highest-volume passenger corridors in the Capital Metro system. In addition to a new transit route for buses, this project provides new infrastructure for people walking and people riding bikes through the corridor, including:

- New northbound bicycle signal on Lavaca Street at 18th Street
- New parking protected bicycle lane on 18th Street between Lavaca Street and Guadalupe Street
- New shared use path on Guadalupe Street between 18th Street and Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard

Additional improvements for people walking and people riding bikes in the area will be implemented later this year and in early 2020, including a concrete protected intersection at 18th Street and Lavaca Street as well as roadway striping changes on Lavaca Street between 18th Street and Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.


## LAVACA STREET AT 18TH STREET

A new two-stage left turn (numbered, yellow path below) box offers people riding bicycles a safer way to turn at this intersection. A new bicycle signal has been installed at the northeast corner of the intersection for people riding bikes on Lavaca Street. The flex posts and green bike box at the northeast corner of the intersection provide space for a person on a bike to wait before crossing west toward the new parking protected bike lane on 18th Street. In a future phase of the project, the flexpost islands will be constructed in concrete to create a protected intersection.



## GUADALUPE STREET AT MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. BOULEVARD

A new two-stage left turn (numbered, yellow path below) box offers people riding bicycles a safer way to turn at this intersection. A green bike box designates a space where a person riding a bicycle can wait during a red light. People riding bicycles at location #1 on the map below can continue north onto Guadalupe Street or head west on Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard using the two-stage left turn box.
