What is a screen zombie? A a child who is so focused on a screen that they don't see you or hear you if you call their name. If this happens it is time for your child to take a break from the screen. Your child might say no or have a meltdown. Each time you help them step away from the screen it will get easier for your child.

Children Under Age 2

Austin PBS follows the American

which say that children younger than 2
cannot learn from a screen. Young
children above age 2 learn best from
screens through small amounts of time.
And they learn better when using
technology with people they know.

Take Breaks

Regular breaks from screens are important for everyone! Adults can become screen zombies too!



We All Learn Differently



We all learn in our own way! Sometimes a school-aged child may not learn something new just by hearing about it. Using many different resources may help your child learn better. Find an online resource that will help your child learn in a way they will understand.

Apps are Safer

Using apps is usually safer than allowing a child to surf the internet. Phones and tablets can be set up to hide internet browsers from younger children.

Find Appropriate Content

Younger children usually have the same screen habits of older children in their home. You can check out reviews of websites, apps, and other online content at commonsensemedia.org. This resource will let you know if a website or app is right for the age of your child.

Control Access



Most computers, smartphones, and tablets have safety settings. You can use these settings to make sure that what your child is watching is safe for his or her age.
