

Q1 Where do you most often enter the Holly Shores part of Festival Beach/the Butler Trail?





It would also be helpful and profitable to have a concession for a drink, snowball, and food trailers on the site, especially for the big boating tournaments on the Lake. Expansion of Martin Pool and a separate pool for small children. Because of school shootings, AISD has put up fencing around Martin and Sanchez Schools. Because the parks and playgrounds at these schools' custodians be responsible to unlock the gates at 4pm to the playgrounds, ball fields, tracks, and tennis courts. I think some of these amenities at these schools are actually on parkland. I've seen people climbing the fences and gates and falling onto the sidewalks trying to access the facilities in the evenings and on the weekends. 
