Exercise: Keep, Toss, Create

1. Keep: The participants were asked what the enjoy most at the Carver.

The replies covered multiple concerns:

a) Idea of the Building:

- The participants conveyed that the building elicited a warm, inviting feeling that they deeply cherished.
- The Carver complex has an inter-generational vibe that the participants greatly enjoy.

b) Experience:

• The building opens to the courtyard permitting programming of the outdoor spaces. The participants indicated they would like more outdoor spaces.

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- Exhibits such as Juneteenth Emancipation or the temporary Christmas tree displays liked by the community.
- The historical timeline adjacent to the Juneteenth exhibit is also of immense value to the community.

c) <u>Programs:</u>

- Participants mentioned that they liked the theatre and used to actively. They indicated that it would be beneficial to the Carver and the community if the theater is expanded.
- The Genealogy Center is another program valuable to the community.

d) Spaces in the building:

- Display spaces in the building focusing on culture are valuable to the community.
- The participants mentioned that they liked the flexibility of spaces in the building to accommodate multiple uses.
- Full-service kitchen (potential to upgrade)

2. Toss: The participants were asked what they appreciate the least or dislike the most about the Carver?

The replies elaborated on various issues:

e) Way finding:

- The Carver complex lacks adequate wayfinding and signage. It needs a signifier to enable instant recognition in the area.
- Safety is a concern.

f) Parking and Accessibility:

- Participants indicated that they often felt unsafe during nighttime around the Carver on account
 of the lack of lighting in the complex. The parking lots set the tone for the Carver and are not well
 lit
- Park space between the school and Carver could use better lighting and other maintenance and wayfinding related improvements

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g) Design and utilization:

- Exhibit hall not large enough, need space for more elaborate exhibits.
- The Carver museum needs well designed spaces for high quality travelling exhibits.
- Participants conveyed that the Carver lacked adequate meeting space on account of which they currently end up meeting in spaces that are not setup appropriately.
- Theater is very steep and poses a hindrance to accessibility.
- Wayfinding to the theater is an issue.
- Lack of functional lighting in common areas (offices, classrooms, conference rooms, dance studios etc.)
- Meeting rooms need good acoustics to prevent sound bleeds and echo.
- Circulation is cumbersome at present and not conducive to move displays with ease up-down the building.
- Bad acoustic in the drum and lobby.
- Overall facility technology could be improved.
- Sunken stage and back pavilion area are under-designed and in need of more landscaping.
- The location of the kitchen is not great for renters. A support space adjacent to the main kitchen to store/wheel stuff around would be useful.
- Leaks in the ceiling.
- Renters often must do makeshift set-up for fabrication.
- Archive needs proper tools and storage.
- The ventilation system in the basement make a disruptive squeaking noise whenever the AC is turned on.
- The open space to the rear of the building lacks proper landscaping, maintenance and upkeep and oftentimes becomes a collector of overflowing water.
- Reception desk within The Drum is not well designed aesthetically and functionally.
- Office space and storage is not adequate. Things often spill out. The Carver needs to have more room for things like tool cart (storage near areas to support their uses)
- Loading dock onramp and maneuvering are circuitous.
- The darkroom is not used much at present and the new design should increase usability of this space.
- Bathrooms lighting is poor, difficult for maintenance (great barometer for comfort / emotion in a building)
- The employee break room should be spacious. At present, the door does not fully open due to lack of space.

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- Dance studio needs better floors and better lighting.
- Exhibits need better support systems, hanging and understanding access, anchor points, electrical. Lighting needs upgrade.

3. Create: The participants were asked what programs or upgrades they would like to see here.

The replies can be categorized as follows:

h) <u>Ideas:</u>

- The participants conveyed that they wished to see small children picking fruits off the trees growing in the Carver complex.
- Elaborate on the ability to accommodate people of ages and stand as a true inter-generational facility.

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i) Way finding and Accessibility:

- Digital signage (both for internal and external). Digital marquee could also be placed at the front of the building to inform people of the events happening in the facility.
- Better flow into the theater and improvements in accessibility.
- The participants suggested looking into the possibility of locating a billboard / sign on 11th street.
- Parking improvements
- Wayfinding to act as a strong signifier for the building.
- Understand what's behind the wall for planning exhibits (utilities, lighting, access points etc)

j) <u>Programming:</u>

- The facility needs more meeting spaces.
- Permanent Wood working or maker space lab for staff.
- Archive room needs more storage.
- Minifood prep area(sink, counter) connected to museum store.
- The Carver could include a space for local entrepreneurs/ vendors / cafe/ foodservice to provide economic opportunity to members of the community and the facility while activating the space well.
- Artist studio space (short or long-term). The long-term spaces, could be spaces for visiting artists and have provisions for living.
- Low cost space that can be rented hourly or daily for artists.

k) Design:

- The participants suggested incorporating an amphitheater outside to host events and movie nights.
- Better technology that aids flexibility
- Kitchen needs upgrading and expansion.
- Find ways to improve the 'pool'
- Enough space to hold events in the spaces they are designed for (e.g. not a meeting in a dance studio)
- Shaded areas and picnic tables outdoor.
- Expand exhibit hall / space for more elaborate exhibits Eg. Smithsonian (travelling displays)
- More inviting entry space / lobby, ability for creative setup.

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
- Participants conveyed the need to include a dedicated community garden space that can be used by existing partners like the Seed to Science program and other community members.
- Interpretative landscape and food garden around the building.
- Some of the participants wished to see a water fountain in the building to welcome people.
- Every room in the Carver to have adequate tools/tool cart.
- Dance studio needs better floors and more natural light. The participants conveyed that the space feels cold right now.
- More workspace in the basements mobile units to put together things here that can be moved across the buildings
- Mobile solutions to functionally move artwork and equipment's up-down the building.
- Providing a café area in the Carver would increase chance encounters and encourage lingering of folks. This is needed provide a strong space for the community to gather.


I) Building Management Systems:

- MEP system upgrades.

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






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
