The City of Austin is evaluating Ross Road between State Highway 71 and Heine Farm Road to identify mobility and safety improvement recommendations included for the Preliminary Engineering Report. This is part of the 2016 Mobility Bond for substandard streets. The Ross Road Substandard Street



Project will evaluate road conditions such as traffic, sidewalks, curbs and more to determine how to enhance mobility and safety for all road users.

Substandard streets are publicly owned roadways within the City of Austin's jurisdiction that do not meet current requirements because they may have pavement widths that are less than 24 feet, and typically lack some curb, gutter, drainage, bicycle accommodations, and/or sidewalk infrastructure.

Currently, there are no design or construction funds allocated for Ross Road improvements. Community input about the roadway collected in spring 2018 is informing draft recommendations for the Preliminary Engineering Report. When these recommendations are developed, they will be shared with the public for another round of feedback. Preparing recommendations and having a plan ready will allow the City to move forward quickly if funding opportunities are identified.

WE ASKED THE COMMUNITY TO GET INVOLVED

The Ross Road Substandard Street Project Team hosted a public open house March 20th, 2018 to share information about the project and collect feedback from the community.

WHAT WE HEARD

A survey was developed in English and Spanish to collect feedback from the community about what improvements to prioritize for Ross Road. **One-hundred and twelve survey participants provided feedback during the input period**. Themes identified in these responses are listed below:

The top three options selected for improvements to Ross Road were:

- Improving accessibility to and from neighborhoods (62 respondents)
- Creating a safe and more supportive environment for pedestrians (59 respondents)
- Creating a safe and more supportive environment for cycling (30 respondents)

Of the 112 respondents, 67 of them reported traveling along Ross Road seven days per week. Twenty-two respondents said they commute along Ross Road five days a week, and four others reported using the road less than five days a week.

More than fifty people attended the March open house. General comments were collected through written comment cards. When asked what improvements they'd like to see along Ross Road, the consensus was that safety was the primary concern. Some of the comment topics included:

- Widening Ross Road into a four-lane
- Considerations for new signals on some of the cross-streets
- Safety improvements to sidewalks, curbs
- Need for lighting/illumination
- Creating a safe and more supportive environment for pedestrians
- Improving drainage along the road

Mapped comments were also collected through the roll plots present at the public meeting. A total of 64 comments were collected on the roll plots with post-it notes or written directly on the map. The primary concerns of those who commented were about flooding, lighting, road widening, and improved sidewalks and bike lanes.

The majority of roll plot comments expressed an interest in the following:

- Widening Ross Road and surrounding streets
- Improving sidewalks and bike lanes for:
 - Greater ease of travel
 - Increased safety for pedestrians and cyclists, particularly around Del Valle Elementary

Many of the roads in this area do not have sidewalks on both sides of the street, if at all; nor are there adequate bike lanes. Other safety concerns included the need for improved lighting along Pearce Lane, Ross Road, and Paloma Blanca Way.

Another concern among attendees was whether proper drainage systems along Ross Road would be a priority as it is in the middle of a floodplain. Some people believe that Ross Road isn't an ideal location for major development since it is prone to flooding.








Existing Cross-Sections








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

Average Daily Traffic (ADT)






