Whether you drive, roll, or walk, the Austin Transportation Department (ATD) works to improve your transportation options. ATD is evaluating <u>Webberville Road and Oak Springs</u> <u>Drive from N Pleasant Valley Road to Springdale Road</u> for changes to enhance the safety and mobility of everyone who uses these streets. Funding for these changes has been identified from the 2016 Mobility Bond Bikeways, Sidewalks, and Safe Routes to School Programs, and the 2018 Bond Pedestrian Crossing Program. You are receiving this notification because you live on and/or own property adjacent to the project limits or are otherwise registered with the City as a stakeholder in the area.

## **Project Goals:**

ATD is proposing changes to provide an all ages and abilities bikeway, improved walkways, and crossings. The proposed changes (see a map on back) were identified through recommendations in the Austin Bicycle Plan, Sidewalk Plan, Pedestrian Safety Action Plan, and the draft Safe Routes to School Infrastructure Report for District 3. This proposal is intended to offer a safer, more comfortable option to walk, bicycle, or roll to many neighborhood destinations (e.g., Austin Community College's Eastview campus, Oak Springs Elementary School, future location of Eastside Memorial High School, Austin Public Library Willie Mae Kirk Branch, local businesses, public parks, and places of worship). The proposed changes are expected to:

- Improve predictability for everyone using the street by dedicating space to walking and bicycling
- Encourage slower motor vehicle speeds
- Shorten street crossing distances for people walking
- Fill sidewalk gaps and improve curb ramps
- Improve bus stop access
- Fill gap in the bikeway network on Webberville Road by extending the existing two-way bikeway north from N Pleasant Valley Road to Oak Springs Drive
