Emerging Teaching Artists Scholarship Application

The Museums and Cultural Programs Division of the Parks and Recreation Department is pleased to partner with MINDPOP in creating a comprehensive professional development effort to increase the number of professional teaching artists of all genres in Austin. The Emerging Teaching Artists (ETA) seminar will also provide a limited number of scholarships to increase the number of artists from underrepresented communities in the classroom. Recipients will have a clear interest in teaching arts to children K-12, with a strong arts resume and demonstrated financial need.

ETA Teaching Artist Training: During Fall of 2016, students will meet twice a week for 6 weeks as they learn the foundations of working as a teaching artist. The ETA seminar series will use hands-on, experiential learning, readings, and discussions with representatives from arts organizations to provide basic skills in curriculum development, classroom management and career development.

Artworks Scholarships

Scholarships may be available for the Fall Term. Scholarships will be awarded to individual artists from underrepresented communities who have a deep interest in teaching art to children, a strong arts background, and demonstrated financial need. We encourage people of diverse backgrounds and abilities to apply.

Scholarship recipients receive a tuition waiver and access to the ETA Professional Development Workshops and Networking opportunities described below.

Professional Development Workshops: Scholarship recipients will have access to several professional development workshops throughout the 2016-2017 school calendar year.

Networking: Class participants will have access to other professional development and networking opportunities, including **Pizza and Paperwork** workshops geared towards increasing employment and funding opportunities for Austin teaching artists.
