Curriculum Title: Máscara de Lucha Libre/Luchador Mask

Time: <u>90 minutes</u>	Ages/Group: <u>5-7</u> Medium: <u>Paper, markers/coloring pencils/crayons</u>
GOALS/OBJECTIVES	To create and decorate a custom Lucha Libre (Mexican Professional Wrestling) mask. To learn about the history and meaning of masks in Mexican Lucha Libre.
How do these goals preserve, create, present or promote cultural arts of Mexican Americans or other Latin@ cultures?	This lesson promotes the Mexican art form of Lucha Libre mask design and creation, and the significance of the mask in Mexican Wrestling culture.

SUPPLIES NEEDED

- Copies of the Lucha Libre Mask templates printed on paper or cardstock One copy of the worksheet •
- One set of markers, crayons or coloring pencils
- Scissors •
- Glitter pens (if available) •
- Holepunch, if available
- Optional: Hole protectors or tape
- Length of string, twine, yarn, or ribbon for each child in order to tie it on their head. Old shoe laces • could also be used if long enough.



 <u>Introductory Activity:</u> Worksheets (1 per student) Read through and fill out the worksheet with your child. 	30 mins
<u>Core Activity</u> : Creation of a Lucha Libre mask	1 hour
 <u>Steps/Procedures:</u> Your child can cut out their mask (do this before coloring so that work is not wasted by a cutting mistakes). Depending on their level of coordination/age, they will need help. Help your child to cut out the eye-holes by: Puncturing it with a pencil then using scissors to cut it out (better if using cardstock) OR Folding on one of the dotted lines and making a cut with scissors, unfolding, then using the scissors to cut out the eye-hole	



t t	 Optional: Place hole protectors or a piece of adhesive tape over each hole that will hold the string that secures the mask to the face. This should prevent tearing. In the case of tape, it is best to place one bit of tape on both sides of the paper. Punch holes in the two sides with a hole punch OR 		
• (Crease the mask over the circles on the sides showing the holes and cut out the circles (parents should do this step!) 		
• (• Thread one end of the string through each side of the mask and tie with a double knot		
• (Cut off any excess string		
	• Put the mask on and tie the mask at the back. Children with long hair should be careful to not tie their hair in the knot.
